Later the privilege of wearing the tunic and dalmatic under the chasuble was granted to Abbots. (See Mitred Abbot.) The use of the dalmatic was also conceded to kings and emperors, both at their coronation and when solemnly assisting at the Holy Sacrifice. Hartmann Maurus, (Lib. de Coronat. Car. V. ap. Du Cange), reckons among the royal insignia, a white albe, all of silk, adorned with precious pearls and jewels; a golden stole also adorned with pearls; a cope of violet colour, all of silk, interwoven with eagles of gold; and an amice of red, in which was woven in like manner a large golden eagle.
